The Franklin, Kentucky City Commission met in Regular Session at 12:00 PM, Monday, **September 11, 2017**, in the City Hall meeting room located at 117 West Cedar Street, Franklin, Kentucky.

Mayor Clark called the meeting to order at 12:00 PM, and Brian Staron, Youth and Family Minister of the Franklin Church of Christ, offered an opening prayer.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion was made by Commissioner Powell and seconded by Commissioner Stewart to approve the minutes as presented of the August 28, 2017, regular meeting of the Franklin City Commission. Voting aye: All. Motion carried unanimously.

GENERAL GOVERNMENT

City Finance Director Shaunna Cornwell received the 2017 Certified Valuations from the Simpson County Property Valuation Administrator to complete the necessary calculation to set the 2017 property tax rates. Mrs. Cornwell recommended the allowable rate of 4%,

Barren River Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan Update

WHEREAS, certain areas of the City of Franklin, Kentucky are subject to periodic flooding, tornados, severe winter storms, severe thunderstorms, and other natural hazards that have potential to cause damages to people and properties within the area; and

WHEREAS, the City of Franklin desires to prepare for and mitigate against such hazards; and

WHEREAS, under the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000, the United States Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) requires that local jurisdictions have in place a FEMA approved Hazard Mitigation Plan as a condition of receipt of certain future Federal mitigation funding after November 1, 2004; and

WHEREAS, the Barren River Area Development District Hazard Mitigation Plan was developed in accordance with the regulations of the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 and the guidance provided by the Federal Emergency Management Agency; and

WHEREAS, to assist cities and counties in meeting this requirement, the Barren River Area Development District has facilitated the development of a multi-jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan covering member jurisdictions of the Barren River Region including the City of Franklin, Kentucky; and

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Franklin City Commission hereby:

- 1. Adopts the Barren River Area Development District 2016 Hazard Mitigation Plan as the official Hazard Mitigation Plan of the City of Franklin, Kentucky; and*
- 2. Vests the Barren River Area Development District with the responsibility, authority, and the means to:

 - a. Inform all concerned parties of this action.*
 - b. Develop an addendum to this Hazard Mitigation Plan if the jurisdiction's unique situation warrants such an addendum.**
- 3. Appoints the Barren River Area Development District Hazard Mitigation Regional Council to assure that the Hazard Mitigation Plan be reviewed according to the Plan Maintenance Procedures in Chapter 6 of the plan and that any needed adjustment to the plan be developed and presented to the Simpson County Local Mitigation subcommittee and to the Franklin City Commission for consideration.*
- 4. Agrees to consider any other official actions as may be reasonable and necessary to carry out the objectives of the Barren River Area Development District 2016 Hazard Mitigation Plan for the City of Franklin, Kentucky.*

This resolution was adopted by a unanimous vote of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Franklin at a meeting held on September 11, 2017.

ORDINANCES




